COVID 19 Update 2 March 22, 2020

Dear Neighbors,

The Adventist Community Services leadership team is thankful for your support and concern in this COVID 19 time. Every effort is being taken to keep essential services operational. With available resources, several changes have been put in place to protect the staff and volunteers during this period of risk. More changes have been made in process to minimize contact and to maintain social distance.

This week the number of families who came to get a food basket was up. What is troubling is that by Thursday 1/2 of the families were first time users of the Pantry! I fear that in the next 2-3 weeks as home food stocks deplete and families' lose jobs and income, the demand for food assistance will explode. I am thankful for individuals and organizations that keep the pantry stocked and services operational.

Service hours are 10-2pm, Monday-Thursday.

To promote safety and social distance, shopper's choice is suspended.

Bring your own bags or box. The food box will contain healthy shelf stable foods, and as available, fresh produce & baked goods.

Distribution will be outside to allow for more social distance.

All surfaces will be sanitized regularly.

## **SUPPORTING THE SERVICES**

Increased service demand and increased safety measures will far outstrip budgeted amounts.

Each day of service is about \$200 in new costs.

Volunteer-Daily needs can fluctuate and are projected to increase. Tasks vary from preparing boxes, serving boxes to intake and clerical. Also food rescue is most helpful. Go to <a href="https://www.communityfoodrescue.org/">https://www.communityfoodrescue.org/</a> locate available food to rescue for the ACSGW pantry. Not at this time, but home delivery may be required going forward.

Donate needed items-shelf stable food, hygiene and sanitizing supplies for families are welcome. Protective gear is also vital. The Center is not taking clothing donations for the next 3 weeks as the free clothing closet is closed until further notice.

In-kind donations can be dropped at 501 Sligo Ave. during normal operating hours (M-Th 9-5) or in the blue box behind Sligo Adventist Church on Greenwood Ave.

As ACS is able, support will be provided to smaller local pantries.

## **OTHER ACTIONS**

Call on a neighbor with limited public interaction. Serve their needs if possible.

Prayer in this time of crisis is welcome and encouraged.
